That up to £2,000 is allocated to the Friends of Hull General Cemetery for the purchase an installation of a storage container on the cemetery site (CPF34-04);</p> <p>e. That application (CPF34-05) is approved in principle following confirmation of successful external match funding and that ownership of the land is confirmed. If Council owned a quotation for EU CCTV equipment is required;</p> <p>f.
