That up to £2,984.01 be allocated to Victoria Dock             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Community Centre for the purchase of window roller blinds (CPF32-02);</li> <li>b. That up to £13,849.63 be allocated to St Marys Church for fencing, CCTV and target hardening equipment (CPF32-03);</li> <li>c. That up to £10,000 be allocated to St Philips Church for the installation of new PVC doors (CPF32-04);</li> <li>d. That application (CPF32-05) be approved in principle and that assurance is sought from the Head of Community Safety that a roller barrier would be an additional deterrent in preventing access to the roof area, and</li> <li>e.
